RE: REQUEST ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 1147 APPROVING THE SUBMISSION OF ALTERNATIVES UNDER THE SUSTAINABLE GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT ACT

The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) establishes a process for local agencies to develop an Alternative in lieu of a Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) (see Water Code §10733.6) for evaluation by DWR. An Alternative is required to be submitted to DWR for review no later than January 1, 2017, and every 5 years thereafter. Additional requirements and evaluation criteria are provided in the GSP Regulations (CCR §358 et seq.). In general, Alternatives must be consistent with Water Code §10733.6(b)).

It is Desert Water Agency's (Agency) plan along with its partners in the Indio and Mission Creek Sub-basins to submit an Alternative Plan pursuant to Part 2.75 of SGMA.

DWR has developed an online Alternative Reporting System that allows local agencies to submit Alternatives and the public to review and comment on the Alternatives. The public comment period will remain open for 60 days following the submission of the Alternative to DWR.

The Agency has worked with other water agencies in the Coachella Valley to develop and implement comprehensive groundwater management plans for the Mission Creek Sub-basin and the Indio Sub-basin, including the Garnet Hill area.

The California Code of Regulations Title 23, section 358.2(d) requires that the entity submitting an Alternative shall explain how the elements of the Alternative are functionally equivalent to the elements of a GSP required by SGMA and are sufficient to demonstrate the ability of the Alternative to achieve the objectives of the Act.

The Agency along with its partners in the Mission Creek and Indio Sub-basins have prepared "Bridge Documents" that are intended to provide an explanation of how the elements of the groundwater management plans are functionally equivalent to the elements of a Plan required by SGMA.

The Agency proposes to submit to DWR along with its partners these groundwater management plans as Alternative GSP's along with their respective Bridge Documents before the January 1, 2017 deadline.

Staff requests adoption of Resolution No.1147 and approval for the submission of the Alternative Documentation for the Indio Sub-basin and the Mission Creek Sub-basin to DWR as Alternatives under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (Water Code, § 10733.6).

RESOLUTION NO. 1147

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF DESERT WATER AGENCY APPROVING THE SUBMISSION OF ALTERNATIVES UNDER THE SUSTAINABLE GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT ACT

WHEREAS, the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) took effect in 2015 and generally requires local agencies to manage local groundwater basins designated as high or medium priority in a more active manner; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Water Resources ("DWR") has designated the Coachella Valley Basin, Indio Sub-basin (Bulletin 118 Basin No. 7-021.01) ("Indio Sub-Basin") and the Coachella Valley Basin, Mission Creek Sub-basin (Bulletin 118 Basin No. 7-021.02) ("Mission Creek Sub-Basin") as medium priority basins under SGMA; and

WHEREAS, Desert Water Agency has worked for many decades with other water agencies in the Coachella Valley to develop and implement comprehensive groundwater management plans for the Mission Creek Sub-basin and the Indio Sub-basin, including the Garnet Hill area; and

WHEREAS, in recognition that some local agencies in the state had undertaken significant groundwater planning and management prior to enactment of SGMA, SGMA contains a mechanism to allow one or more local agencies to submit an "alternative" to meet the objectives of SGMA, provided that such alternative is submitted to DWR no later than January 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, Desert Water Agency intends to work with its local agency partners to submit to DWR as SGMA alternatives for the Indio Sub-basin and the Mission Creek Sub-basin the Coachella Valley Water Management Plan (2002), the Water Management Plan Update (2010), the Mission Creek-Garnet Hill Water Management Plan (2013), one or more "Bridge Documents", and related documentation ("Alternative Documentation");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of Desert Water Agency hereby approves the submission of the Alternative Documentation for the Indio Sub-basin and the Mission Creek Sub-basin to DWR as alternatives under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (Water Code, § 10733.6).

STAFF REPORT TO DESERT WATER AGENCY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

DECEMBER 20, 2016

RE: NOVEMBER 2016 WATER USE REDUCTION FIGURES

Desert Water Agency and its customers achieved a 21 percent reduction in total water production during November 2016 compared to the same month in 2013 – the baseline year used by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) to measure statewide conservation achievements. Desert Water Agency's cumulative water savings June 2015 through November 2016 is 24% percent. The cumulative savings beginning in June of 2016 when we put our 10-13% target in place is 20%.

DWA is asking its customers to save 10-13% to help achieve long-term sustainability. DWA reports its production to the state on a monthly basis.

Below is additional information reported to the State Board for November 2016.

Comments: The Agency's service area is highly seasonal making population analysis a complex task. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) analyzes data on a per capita basis. Historically, DWA has submitted data based on the permanent population of the service area; however that data does not accurately reflect water use in DWA's service area which has a highly seasonal population. Based on local data, the correct population is higher than previously reported. The Residential Gallons Per Capita Per Day (R-GPCD) is being submitted using the corrected population.

DWA would like it noted that the amount of fresh water outflow to the ocean during the month of November was 521,375 acre feet.

Additionally, since it began recycling water Desert Water Agency has reclaimed 90,072 acre feet. If our recycled water production for November was taken into consideration against our potable production, the conservation achieved would have been several percentage points higher.
