


WATER ACADEMY GOES VIRTUAL


WANT TO KNOW MORE?

FAQ Can I get help with my water bill?

Yes. Covid-19 has caused difficulties for so many in our community. Those affected financially can take advantage of two assistance programs to help pay their water bills - Help2Others and the CAP CARES program (funded through the CARES Act). PROGRAM HELPS HUNDREDS IN NEED

The Help2Others Assistance Program has had success helping your neighbors pay their water bills. From July – November 2020, more than \$45,000 has been issued in credits to 552 water customers of DWA and other water agencies in the Coachella Valley. The program provides up to \$100 in water bill credits and is administered by United Way of the Desert.
