19194. President Bloomer called upon Assistant General Manager General Manager's Report Johnson to provide an update on Agency operations.

Mr. Johnson provided an update on Agency operations and noted his meetings and activities for the past several weeks.

19195. President Bloomer noted the minutes for the July 1, 2021 Executive Committee meeting were provided in the Board's packet.

19196. President Bloomer opened the meeting for public comment.

There being no one from the public wishing to address the Board, President Bloomer closed the public comment period.

19197. President Bloomer called upon Assistant General Manager Johnson to present staff's request for Board Action Regarding two Claims filed by William Strong.

Mr. Johnson explained that the two claims were filed on June 16, 2021 by William Strong, the property manager for 630 and 640 Williams Rd.

Mr. Johnson reported that DWA stand-by responded to a call for service at 630 and 640 Williams Rd at 12:41 p.m. Staff did not see a leak and assumed it was a sewer blockage. The property owner contacted a plumber and Veolia sewer service. He noted that at 5:53 pm., stand-by was called back to the location where an exposed leaking 4-inch water line was found. Staff discovered the sewer lateral was directly under the water main only separated by a couple of inches. Mr. Johnson explained that the 4-inch water main had a leak on the bottom which eroded a hole in the sewer lateral causing the water to back up into the shower drain and the water came through the wall that divides 630 and 640 Williams Rd. Mr. Johnson noted that the distance from the sewer lateral hole and water main to 640 Williams Rd is approximately 150 feet. Staff notified ACWA/JPIA and they have assigned an adjuster who has contacted Mr. Strong to inspect the property.

Staff recommends that the Board deny the claims for damages filed by William Strong for 630 and 640 Williams Road and forward to ACWA/JPIA for their handling.

#### A. DWA Events

Staff presented a concept for a new event that would showcase agency equipment similar to Fire Department "touch a truck" events. The Committee directed staff to explore an event like this in lieu of some of the existing events.

Staff also noted that webinar participation has been waning. The Committee noted that many community members may be experiencing "Zoom fatigue" and welcomed the suggestion to hold webinars in coordination with CV Water Counts.

#### B. <u>Community Events</u>

Staff highlighted a list of events that would be typical of DWA involvement. The Committee discussed the water trailer and a trial period to provide canned or boxed water in lieu of the trailer.

#### C. Sentinel Mitigation Update

The Committee reviewed the conservation projects sponsored by Sentinel in the previous fiscal year and discussed the existing agreements.

#### D. ACWA Communications Committee

Staff sought guidance on Outreach & Conservation Department ACWA Committee participation. The Committee noted that the Water Management Committee seemed particularly important to the department and Agency business.

#### E. Esprit Grass Removal Appeal

The Committee reviewed the appeal for special consideration since the HOA had already removed grass prior to their application. The Committee rejected the appeal and directed staff to inform the HOA and encourage future program participation.

#### F. Pipe Insulation and Recirculation Rebates

The Committee discussed hot and cold water issues with private customer exterior plumbing and potential future incentive options. The Committee did not favor a rebate program for the insulation of onsite exterior plumbing.

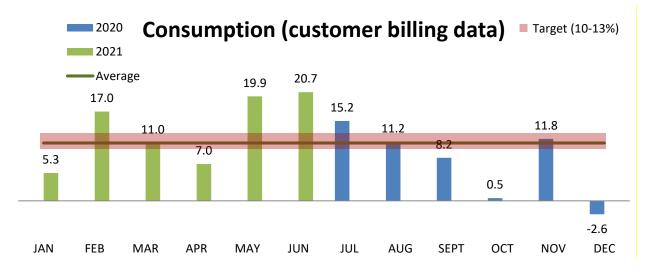

#### STAFF REPORT TO DESERT WATER AGENCY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

### JULY 20, 2021

#### **RE: JUNE 2021 WATER USE REDUCTION FIGURES**

Desert Water Agency customers achieved a 20.68% reduction in metered potable water consumption during June 2021 compared to the same month in 2013 – the baseline year used by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) to measure statewide conservation achievements. DWA continues to report its production to the state on a monthly basis, despite mandatory conservation ending in 2017.



Over the past 12 months, consumption is trending 11% lower compared to 2013. DWA is asking its customers to voluntarily save 10-13% compared to 2013 to help achieve long-term sustainability.

While overall water use is down 20.68% in June 2021 compared to June 2013, if we account for the new meters/customers since 2013, the reduction is roughly 27%. The Governor recently asked Californians to voluntarily conserve 15% compared to last year. DWA per customer usage is up by about 8% compared to last year. This could be attributed to warmer weather and/or occupancy changes resulting from COVID-19. There is presently no requirement for the Agency or any of its customers to meet a certain savings requirement.

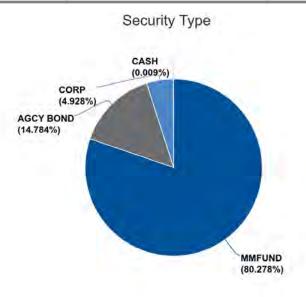

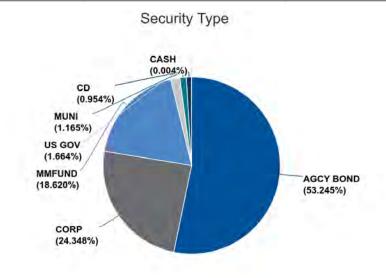

Interest bearing time deposit. FDIC insured up to \$250,000 per depositor, per FDIC-insured bank.

#### Corporate Notes

Debt securities issued by a for-profit company.

#### Money Market Funds

High quality, short-term debt instruments, cash and cash equivalents. Utilized for overnight holding of investment proceeds prior to reinvesting or transferring to Agency checking accounts.

#### **Municipal Bonds**

Fixed income securities issued by states, cities, counties, special districts and other governmental entities.

#### **Treasury Notes**

Fixed income securities issued by the federal government with maturities between two and ten years backed by the full faith and credit of the United States government.

#### Funds Managed by Contracted Parties - LAIF

The Desert Water Agency has contracted with the California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) for investment of Agency funds. LAIF is a voluntary program created by Section 16429.1 et seq. of the California Government Code. LAIF is an investment alternative for California's local governments and special districts. This program offers local agencies the opportunity to participate in a major portfolio, which invests hundreds of millions of dollars, using the investment expertise of the state Treasurer's Office professional investment staff at no additional cost to the taxpayer or ratepayer. All Agency funds invested with LAIF are available for withdrawal upon demand and may not be altered, impaired or denied in any way (California Government Code Section 16429.4).

#### **Market Value Source**

Current market values are provided by Clearwater Analytics for all investment types other than LAIF. LAIF market values are recorded at PAR value.

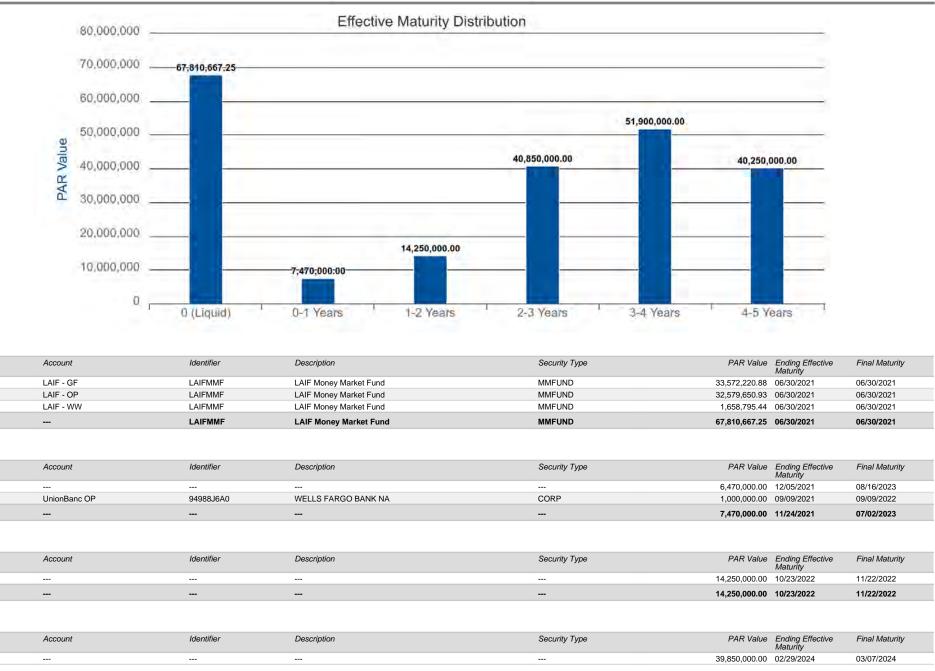

## GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT July 20, 2021

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#### Stolen Backflow – 1050 E. Palm Canyon Drive/Deep Well Rd.

On July 13 at approximately 10:00 a.m., Assistant Construction Superintendent Kuhlman was informed that there was a stolen backflow. The backflow was located on the east side of Deep Well Rd., north of East Palm Canyon Drive (L'Horizon Hotel). Staff is waiting to hear back from the property owner to see whether they want the Agency to replace it or if they will themselves. They were advised to file a police report. The water loss was metered.



#### Wellness Grant Award

On July 13, DWA was notified that we have been awarded a wellness grant from ACWA-JPIA in the amount of \$1,700. Staff applied for a \$2,000 grant and they awarded all approved agencies funding at 85% of the requested grant. This is the fourth year in a row that we have been awarded a wellness grant from ACWA-JPIA.

In previous years we have used the grant money for healthy snacks for employees, installing two water bottle filling stations, distributing new water bottles to employees, purchasing DWA face masks for employees, and purchasing new equipment for the employee fitness center. With this year's grant we are looking to offer a Wellable fitness app to employees and offer fitness challenges and provide incentives throughout the year for employees who participate in the challenges.

#### Federal Legislative Update

<u>Drinking Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Act of 2021</u> - This measure passed the full senate on 04/29/21, and is currently being held at the Speakers Desk in the House of Representatives. If passed by the house and signed into law, it would authorize more than \$35 billion for water resource development projects. The funds will be disbursed using new grant programs, existing grant programs, and EPA revolving loan funds. Of note, the legislation will create a "Midsize and Large Drinking Water System Infrastructure Resilience and Sustainability Program." This program will allow the EPA Administrator to award grants to increase resilience to natural hazards and extreme weather events.

<u>FUTURE Drought Resiliency Act</u> - On 05/20/21 Chairman Jared Huffman reintroduced the FUTURE Drought Resiliency Act, which has been referred to the appropriate authorizing committees. The measure aims to provide investments for surface and groundwater storage, while strongly encouraging the use of water recycling, desalination, and water efficiency and conservation to improve drought planning and habitat restoration. Of note, the measure includes the income tax exclusion for homeowners who receive rebates from water utilities to purchase and install water conservation systems in residential homes.

<u>Twenty-First Century Dams Act</u> - The measure was introduced into the House on 07/09/21, and will be introduced by Senator Feinstein in the Senate later in July. It establishes an interagency advisory council and a stakeholder advisory board to select and fund the removal of publicly and privately owned dams with the consent of dam owners. The goal is to reduce public safety risks, restore habitat for native species of fish and wildlife, improve water quality, and increase climate resilience. Further, it authorizes \$400 million for Reclamation through each fiscal year from FY22 - FY26 for safety improvements, including concrete repair, tunnel work, gate repair and replacement, environmental improvements, transmission, distribution, and substation upgrades to name a few.

#### Federal Legislative Update (Cont'd)

<u>House Energy-Water Appropriations</u> - On 07/12/21, the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Energy and Water Development, and Related Agencies favorably reported the appropriations measure to the full House Appropriations Committee. The measure includes the following funding levels:

- \$1.95 billion for the Bureau of Reclamation
- \$1.792 billion for Bureau of Reclamation Water and Related Resources
- \$413 million for Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act
- \$191.4 million for WaterSMART programs
- \$1 million for Bureau of Reclamation's new aging infrastructure account
