ELECTION MAP UPDATE

In the November 2022 elections, DWA, like most other government agencies and cities across California, will be using new election division maps.

The 2020 Census results required DWA to modify their current map, adjusting for the increase in population and ensuring that minority communities are represented fairly.

DWA held public hearings, two public workshops and invited the public to participate in the process – even by drawing their own maps.

Desert Water Agency is required to adopt a new map before the April 17 deadline. The selected map will be used in November when three division seats (Divisions 1, 2 & 3) are up for election.

If you're thinking about ways you can be more eco-friendly, being water wise should top the list. Water is a precious resource we all need to work together to protect. A lot of energy goes into delivering water so the less water you use, the more energy you save as well.

conservation program budget by \$300,000 earlier this year so customers can keep getting money back for water-wise investments.

With lots of attention on the statewide drought, more people are using DWA conservation programs – especially our grass removal and smart irrigation controller programs.

We are excited to increase the funds and have even more customers benefit from our incentives.

Our grass removal program provides \$2 per square foot to replace your grass with water efficient landscaping. You do need to apply before you remove your grass!

We also have incentives of up to \$250 for weather-based irrigation controllers for homeowners and up to \$10,000 for HOAs and businesses.

Residents can also get up to \$7 per water efficient sprinkler nozzle and up to \$250 towards EnergyStar washing machines.

We are proud to partner with you to save water and to make Palm Springs more sustainable.

If you see water waste, please report it to DWA. It will help the property owner get it fixed and it could help them avoid a fine. The best way to let us know is to go to www.dwa.org/report and fill out a water waste report online. You can also call our office at 760-323-4971 or email waterwaste@dwa.org. For emergencies, like hit hydrants or water leaking from the middle of the street, call 760-323-4971 and dial 9.
