Happy New Year! There are lots of ways you can save water inside and outside your home to help reduce your water bill and be more water efficient.

INSIDE:

- Check for kitchen & bathroom leaks
- Skip pre-rinse & run full loads of dishes & clothes washers
- Install a premium efficient toilet
- Upgrade to an Energy Star washer
- Shorten your shower
- Turn off water when brushing teeth or washing your face

OUTSIDE:

- Check your irrigation system for leaks
- Install a weather-based smart controller
- Swap old sprinkler nozzles with efficient ones
- Replace your grass with desert plants
- Water early in the morning or late in the day to avoid evaporation

How can I access my bill online?



Register for myDWA at www.myDWA.org, and you will have access to your current bill online to monitor water usage with useful charts, bill history, and other helpful information. When you sign up to use the myDWA online customer portal, you will also have the option to go paperless and sign up for autopay.

VITAL STATE PROJECTS MOVING FORWARD





DWA plans decades ahead to make sure that our water supply can meet our community's future needs. Imported water supplies are a critical part of this strategy. As 2023 drew to a close, two key projects that support our water future had big milestones.

Delta-Conveyance Sites Reservoir will be about an hour north of Sacramento in Maxwell, California. It will capture water in wet years and will deliver it in drier years. It will also include water storage and allow for releases to protect the environment. In November, the Bureau of **Reclamation and Sites Project Authority** certified its final environmental impact report. Construction is projected to start in 2026.

> The Delta Conveyance Project will modernize the State Water Project to make it more reliable and resilient. It includes a single tunnel through the California Delta. As our climate changes, the upgraded system will better capture, move and store water.

The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) approved the project and certified the final environmental impact report on Dec. 21, 2023. For more information go to www.dwa.org/stateprojects.

RATES INCREASE & ASSISTANCE REMINDER!
