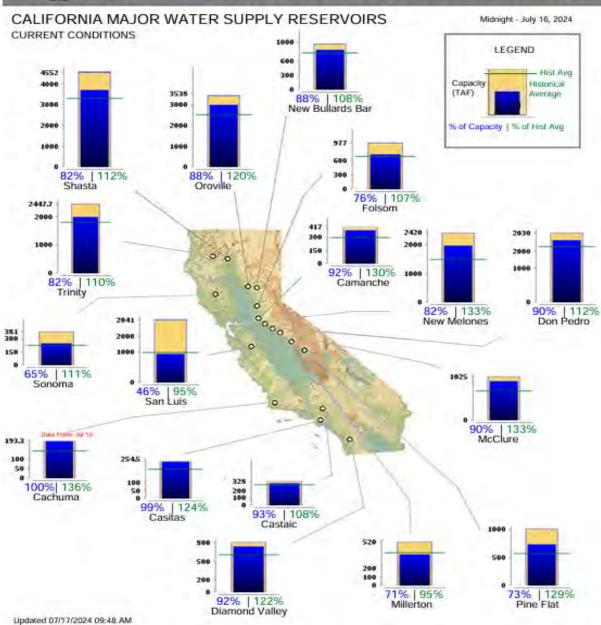

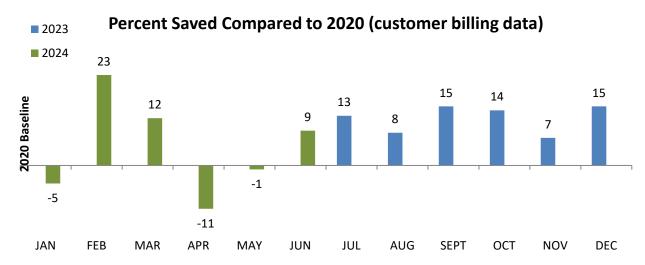

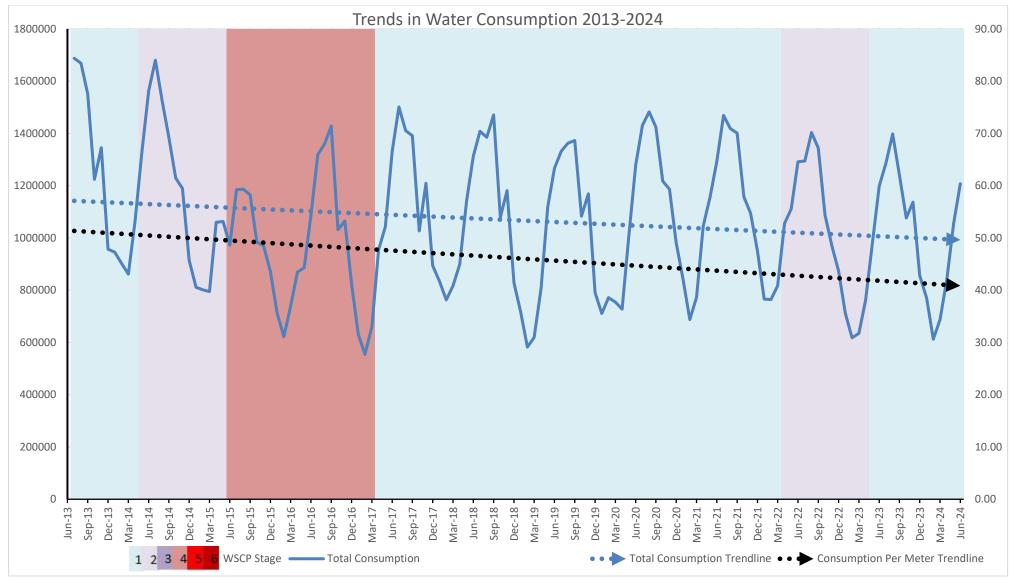

## RE: JUNE 2024 WATER USE REDUCTION FIGURES

Desert Water Agency customers decreased water consumption per meter by 9% during June 2024 compared to the same month in 2020 – the baseline year the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) used to measure statewide conservation achievements during the 2020-2022 drought. This is despite June 2024 having higher average temperatures than June 2020. The decrease may be explained by the success of outreach programs, results of incentive programs, or early response to the new Making Conservation a California Way of Life regulation. There is also a notable uptick in water waste reports and citations over the last few months compared to 2023.



Over the past 12 months, consumption per meter has been trending 9% lower compared to 2020. DWA is committed to conservation and has met the goals of many voluntary and mandatory calls for conservation such as <u>SB X7-7</u> (20% by 2020). The <u>Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life</u> regulation (unanimously approved on July 3, 2024) will provide DWA with a water use objective – in essence, an agency-wide water budget. This will inform DWA's future water conservation objectives.



The graph above shows total monthly water consumption trending downward over time. It also shows that water use *per meter* is trending downward even faster. This indicates significant conservation gains given that population and business grew while water consumption continued to decline. The graph also highlights Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP) levels.

# RE: REQUEST BOARD AUTHORIZATION FOR GENERAL MANAER TO EXECUTE THE DWA & CITY OF PALM SPRINGS COST-SHARE AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATIVE TURF REBATE PROGRAM

In response to the drought emergency declaration by Governor Newsom in Spring 2021, Desert Water Agency began to increase its incentive programs outreach to encourage and increase community participation. In July of 2022, DWA increased its incentive for grass replacement from \$2 to \$3 per square foot.

Additionally, in December 2022 and February 2023, the City of Palm Springs elected to provide additional incentive funding to DWA's program amounting to \$550,000. The matching program had great demand and in June 2023, Palm Spring Council approved \$1,150,000 for their two-year budget cycle for Fiscal Years 24-25.

At that time, the City of Palm Springs and Desert Water Agency agreed that DWA would facilitate the program, approve applications and provide rebates, including the city match, to residents. It was also agreed that the City of Palm Springs would then transfer the funds paid out back to DWA in order to make DWA whole.

For funds to be transferred from the City of Palm Springs to Desert Water Agency a formal agreement is needed (Attachment 1). The agreement is modeled after similar local city matching rebate programs.

The City of Palm Springs authorized the City Manager to execute the Cost-Share Agreement at their July 9, 2024 City Council meeting (Attachment 2).

#### Fiscal Impact:

There are no budgetary impacts. This will be a reimbursement of program funds spent. Finance Director Saenz has reviewed this report.

#### Legal Review:

Legal reviewed the cost-share agreement prior to sending to the City of Palm Springs.

#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to sign the cost-share agreement between Desert Water Agency & the City of Palm Springs.

# Desert Water Agency and City of Palm Springs Cost-Share Agreement for a Cooperative Turf Conversion Rebate Program

- 1. The purpose of this agreement is to formally document joint participation by Desert Water Agency ("DWA") and the City of Palm Springs ("City") in a turf conversion rebate program ("Turf Rebate Program"). This program will provide customers residing within the City of Palm Springs the opportunity to convert turf to water efficient landscape. Turf conversions will help accomplish DWA's and the City's mutual goals of increased efficiency in landscape water use and conservation of potable water supplies.
- It is understood by both parties that this agreement provides additional funds through the City's match to DWA's existing funding of the Turf Rebate Program. Funds for the Turf Rebate Program are available to City's residents and businesses on a first-come-first-served delivery sequence until the initial funding has been exhausted.
- 3. The program is limited to residential, commercial, and HOA turf conversion projects.
- 4. DWA will complete pre-conversion and final inspections prior to disbursing funds to customers upon completion of approved projects. DWA reserves the right to deny applications based upon the attached program guidelines. Applicants who are denied may dispute and appeal the denial in accordance with DWA's Non-Billing Dispute and Appeal Policy. DWA shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers, officials, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, losses, damage, injuries, and liability, direct or indirect (including any and all costs, expenses and attorneys' fees in connection therewith), arising out of the Turf Rebate Program, except for any such claim arising out of the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the City.
- 5. The City agrees to provide a total contribution not to exceed \$550,000 for Fiscal Years (FY) 2021-2023 and \$1,150,000 for FY 2023-2025 to the Turf Rebate Program, as follows.
  - a. For FY 2021-2023 Funding:
    - i. The City agrees to provide a contribution of \$3.00 per square foot up to a maximum of \$5,000 per project to eligible residential and HOA/Commercial applicants on first-come-first-served delivery sequence up to a maximum of \$500,000 of FY 2021-2023 funding.
    - ii. For customers who are part of a disadvantaged community, the City agrees to provide a contribution of \$4.00 per square foot to eligible residential applicants on first-come-first-served delivery sequence up to a maximum of \$50,000 of FY 2021-2023 funding.
    - iii. DWA agrees to pay directly to customers the full rebate amount available, including both DWA's and the City's contribution, and subsequently invoice the City on a quarterly basis for reimbursement of the City's contribution. The City's contribution will be due within 30 days of DWA's invoice date.
  - b. For FY 2023-2025 Funding:
    - The City agrees to provide a contribution of \$1.00 per square foot to eligible residential and HOA/Commercial applicants on first-comefirst-served delivery sequence.

- ii. DWA agrees to pay directly to customers the full rebate amount available, including both DWA's and the City's contribution, and subsequently invoice the City on a quarterly basis for reimbursement of the City's contribution. The City's contribution will be due within 30 days of DWA's invoice date.
- 6. DWA plans, receives and process applications, documentation, photographs, and plans, and will share all documentation with City staff upon request.
- 7. The City and DWA agree to consider the continuation of funding for this program in subsequent fiscal years if funding is available. DWA will advise the City in writing if and when all City-approved funds have been committed to projects or reserved for projects. Should all City-approved funds be committed or reserved for projects, the City Manager will advise DWA whether to accept new applications and commit to reimbursing DWA for those rebates issued in excess of the approved funds, subject to allocation of funds pursuant to a duly adopted City budget.

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# STAFF REPORT TO DESERT WATER AGENCY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

# **AUGUST 6, 2024**

#### RE: CUSTOMER APPEAL - DARRELL THOMAS

On December 17, 2019, the Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 1224 "Policy on Discontinuation of Residential Water Service for Nonpayment", which became effective on February 1, 2020. This resolution was in accordance with Senate Bill 998 that was adopted by the California Legislature in 2018, which imposes new and expanded customer protections regarding discontinuation of residential water service for nonpayment and related matters.

Section 5 of Resolution No. 1224 addresses the procedures to contest or appeal a bill, in particular Section 5.3 (Appeal to Board of Directors).

"Any customer whose timely complaint or request for an investigation pursuant to this Section 5 has resulted in an adverse determination by the Agency may appeal the determination to the Board of Directors by filing a written notice of appeal with the Agency Secretary within ten (10) business days of the Agency's mailing of its determination. Upon receiving the notice of appeal, the Agency Secretary will set the matter to be heard at an upcoming Board meeting and mail the customer written notice of the time and place of the hearing at least ten (10) days before the meeting. The decision of the Board shall be final."

The appellant, Darrell Thomas, is requesting relief from his financial payment plan for \$726.54 and his May bill of \$299.87 for a total of \$1,026.41. He is requesting relief due to the following:

- 1. He recently discovered his pool had a leak and had to pay to get it fixed.
- He then discovered a major leak under the house, which he paid additional money to correct.
- 3. He claims that since he didn't use the water, it went back into the aquifer.

#### Appeal Summary/Procedures:

- 1. 06/12/23 Consumption at property increases but not significantly enough to initiate a reread.
- 2. 04/11/24 Customer requests to be placed on a payment plan in the amount of \$871.84.

- 3. 06/20/24 Customer files dispute with DWA for consumption at property during time of leaks.
- 4. 07/02/24 Dispute denial letter is emailed and mailed to customer.
- 5. 07/11/24 Customer files an appeal.
- 6. Staff has provided the Board with the correspondence for this appeal. (Attachment 1).
- 7. Staff records of the account (Attachment 2).
- 8. The appellant, if in attendance, will be invited by the Board President to speak concerning the appeal.
- 9. After hearing the appellant, the Board will decide whether to grant or deny the appeal.

#### Fiscal Impact:

If the Board decides to deny the appeal, there will be no fiscal impact. If the Board decides to grant the appeal, the Agency may credit the account up to \$1,026.41.

Based on the actions discovered at the property, Staff recommends that the Board of Directors deny the appeal of Darrell Thomas.

4th The water did not even go into my house. It went directly back to the aquifer with no touch of human hands. Are you saying that "pristine unused water" is not a value to the desert or to DWA? Can I send you an invoice for untouched/unused water? You are a monoply and I have no choice but to use DWA.

5th I am fine with a compromise but I think it is grossly unfair that I support low-income users with DWA, SCE, and many other groups AND the one time that I need assitance, I get a form letter from you (Garrett Nelson).

I think that a reasonable compromise is waive the remaining payments that I have on my payment plan and the last invoice of \$299.87 and call it a "done deal".

Thank you for reaching out to us. We understand your concern about your bill and spike in water use.

While Desert Water Agency does not typically issue credits for leaks, we have a new program to help eligible low-income customers that have a high-water bill due to a leak.

## Criteria (must meet both):

- 1. Apply and qualify for DWA's Help2Others program (Details for United Way: <a href="https://www.unitedwayofthedesert.org/help2others">www.unitedwayofthedesert.org/help2others</a> (760)323-2731)
- 2. Had a recent unusually high bill (water use more than 2.5 times your average for that month) and provide proof of a leak repair, Desert Water Agency will credit your bill for the excess water use. (For example, if you qualify for Help2Others and you get a February bill showing 70 units of water and normally use 10 units in February, you can submit your leak repair receipts/invoices and Desert Water Agency will credit you for 60 units of water.)

If you're eligible, please email your receipts/repair invoices to <u>assistance@dwa.org</u> -unfortunately, if you are not eligible, we are unable to offer you assistance.

If you are not satisfied with this solution, please fill out an appeal form (www.dwa.org/appeal) within 10 business days of this letter and our Board of Directors will review your appeal at a public board meeting. If no appeal is submitted, the decision above will be final.

I am requesting Relief from my financial Payment Plan AND the previous balance of \$299.87. Priscilla has been working with me. She is a true asset to your company. She has been extremely helpful, but this is out of her decision-making authority.

Per her suggestion I have reached out to the relief organizations that DWA refers to when customers have financial difficulties. Unfortunately, I do not meet their requirements of income/number of people in the household, etc. That is why I am reaching out to you for an exception/relief.

The issue is that over time since I moved in May 2022, I have slowly noticed unusual water usage. Again, I had no history of the house. I was under the impression that all was ok. Over time and most noticeably my water pressure was decreasing, and some sprinklers were not working as they should. So, I started watching more closely water bill and what the "house was doing".

I discovered that the pool had a leak. I had to drain the pool, it was fixed for \$1,650 in May 2024. I had to refill the pool. I am not asking for relief for the re-fill of the pool.

In May/June 2024, after the pool was fixed, I noticed that water pressure was dropping substantially. Finally, it just stopped all together. I knew that I had a major problem. I called American Leak Detection of Palm Springs. They verified that I had a major leak somewhere under the house slab.

For almost 10 days I had to manually shut water off at the street except when trying to take showers, etc. Which was difficult. We purchased potable water to drink and used the pool water to flush the toilets for about a week while trying to determine where the leak was.

The leak was MAJOR and it was under the house slab. The water from DWA was not even able to reach inside the house. The water had just been going back down to the aquifer without being touched by any human. As you look at my consumption, you can graphically see past usage, when I had leaks fixed (water usage was less) and now, my present usage is getting more stable and at a normal rate considering that 4 adults live in the house.

The cost of diagnosing and repairing the major leak under the house was \$3,750. On leaks (pool and house) over the last 60 days I have spent \$5400 plus being billed for all water even though I have not even touched most of the water since in effect I am discharging the water back directly to recharge the aquifer under my house.

I have had a well in the past, so I know typical outdoor indications of water leaks. But this leak has been happening so long without me even knowing (there was no standing water, green areas, or any indication of a leak with standing water, etc.) there could even be cracks under the ground to facilitate the recharge of water. Who knows but I sure did not get to use it.

My request considering my situation, is relief from the payment plan (months 4-12 @ \$72.65 / month as well as relief from the previous balance of \$299.87. I would like to start "fresh" now that all leaks are fixed, and I am back to regular usage and billing.

My request rational is that I did not "use" the water, most of it over time went directly back to the aquifer and there is not an exact way to determine what I really used. I do not challenge that I need to pay for the re-fill of water for the swimming pool.

PLEASE provide relief for 9 months payment plan x 72.65 = 653.85 plus 299.87 Total = 953.72 (previous balance of invoice read date 6/11/2024). Plus, I have paid 5,400 in plumbing repairs. Over the past 12 months, I have paid for water even though I had unknown leak.

My budget has just been blown away with water leaks and repairs, as well as expensive dental issues. I am frankly out of money and cannot pay for water. I do not want to have my water turned off either.

If you cannot grant my total request for relief, can you possibly for extenuating circumstances provide a good portion of my relief request?

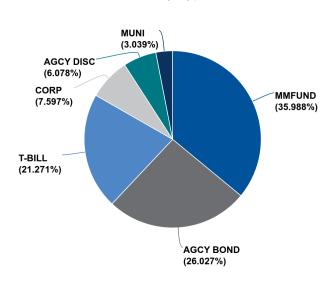

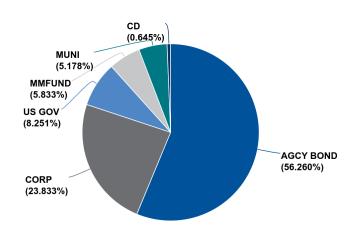

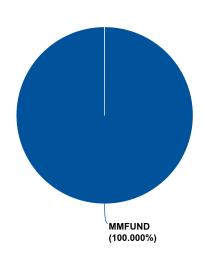

# Treasury Notes

Fixed income securities issued by the federal government with maturities between two and ten years backed by the full faith and credit of the United States government.

# Funds Managed by Contracted Parties - LAIF

The Desert Water Agency has contracted with the California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) for investment of Agency funds. LAIF is a voluntary program created by Section 16429.1 et seq. of the California Government Code. LAIF is an investment alternative for California's local governments and special districts. This program offers local agencies the opportunity to participate in a major portfolio, which invests hundreds of millions of dollars, using the investment expertise of the state Treasurer's Office professional investment staff at no additional cost to the taxpayer or ratepayer. All Agency funds invested with LAIF are available for withdrawal upon demand and may not be altered, impaired or denied in any way (California Government Code Section 16429.4).

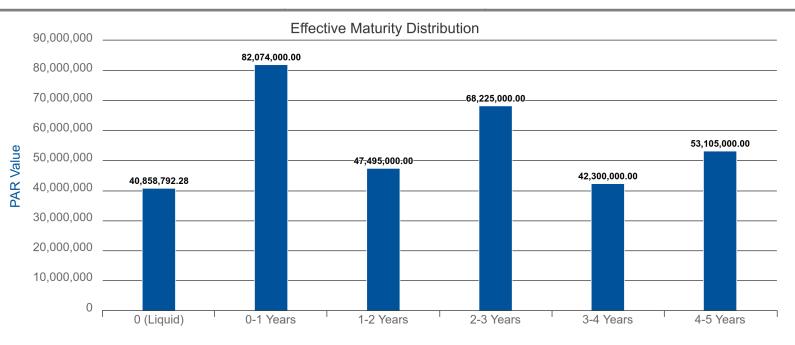

# GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT AUGUST 6, 2024

# Chino Reservoir Fire Hazard Abatement Project

In late June 2024, the Palm Springs Fire Department inspected a portion of the Agency's property adjacent to the roadway near Chino Reservoir, on Chino Canyon Road.

The Fire Inspector determined that, to be in compliance with the California High Fire Hazard Severity Zone standards, the vegetation close to the roadway needed to be cleared out.

DWA contracted Down To Earth Landscaping to clear the zone of all fire hazards according to the standards set by Palm Springs Municipal Code, and the 2022 CA Fire Code.

The work was completed in one week, requiring 120-man hours of labor, plus disposal. This project was considered regulatory compliance, costing the Agency \$4,878.00.

# **Strategic Planning Project Update**

In September 2023, the Board of Directors directed staff to begin the process of establishing a Strategic Plan for the Agency. The Board expressed its desire to contract with a qualified Strategic Planning Services Provider to facilitate the development of mission and vision statements and facilitate discussions for the development of a strategic plan document for the use and guidance of the Agency's Management and Board of Directors.

In early 2024, the Agency issued a Request For Proposal (RFP) for the desired Strategic Planning services and received three proposals. Ultimately, based on staff recommendations, the Board did not accept any of the submitted proposals and directed staff to re-issue the RFP to a broader group of service providers, emphasizing staff's preferred method of performing the work.

In May 2024, the RFP was reissued with a proposal submission deadline of July 22, 2024. The Agency received two new proposals. These proposals have been reviewed by Staff and a preferred provider has been selected to move forward with contract negotiations.

Once contract negotiations are complete, the contract will come before the Board of Directors for approval at the August 20th Board meeting. The target project start date will be in the beginning of September 2024 with an approximate 6-to-8-month duration.

# **DWR 2023 Delivery Capability Report Released**

On July 31, 2024, the Department of Water Resources released its final 2023 State Water Project Delivery Capability Report. The report presents a new and enhanced analysis of current and future expectations for the SWP water supply if no new adaptation actions are taken. According to the report, SWP delivery capability and reliability could be reduced as much as 23% in 20 years due to changing flow patterns and extreme weather shifts – underscoring the need for California to continue addressing the impacts of climate change and upgrading infrastructure.

According to DWR, a 23% decline would be equivalent to about 496,000 acre-feet a year, enough to supply 1,736,000 homes for a year. This reinforces the serious need for California to boost water supplies to account for any SWP losses in the coming years, including the Delta Conveyance Project, Sites Reservoir, desalination projects, and more.

The Delivery Capability Report is used widely both within and outside the SWP for water supply planning. The information in the report is a key component of the drought planning done by the SWP and is fundamental to the drought planning done by the public water agencies that receive SWP and Central Valley Project water. The report provides the information needed by these agencies to develop and manage their own water supply portfolios and is an important input for Sustainable Groundwater Management Plans, Urban Water Management Plans, Agricultural Water Management Plans, and Integrated Regional Water Management Plans.

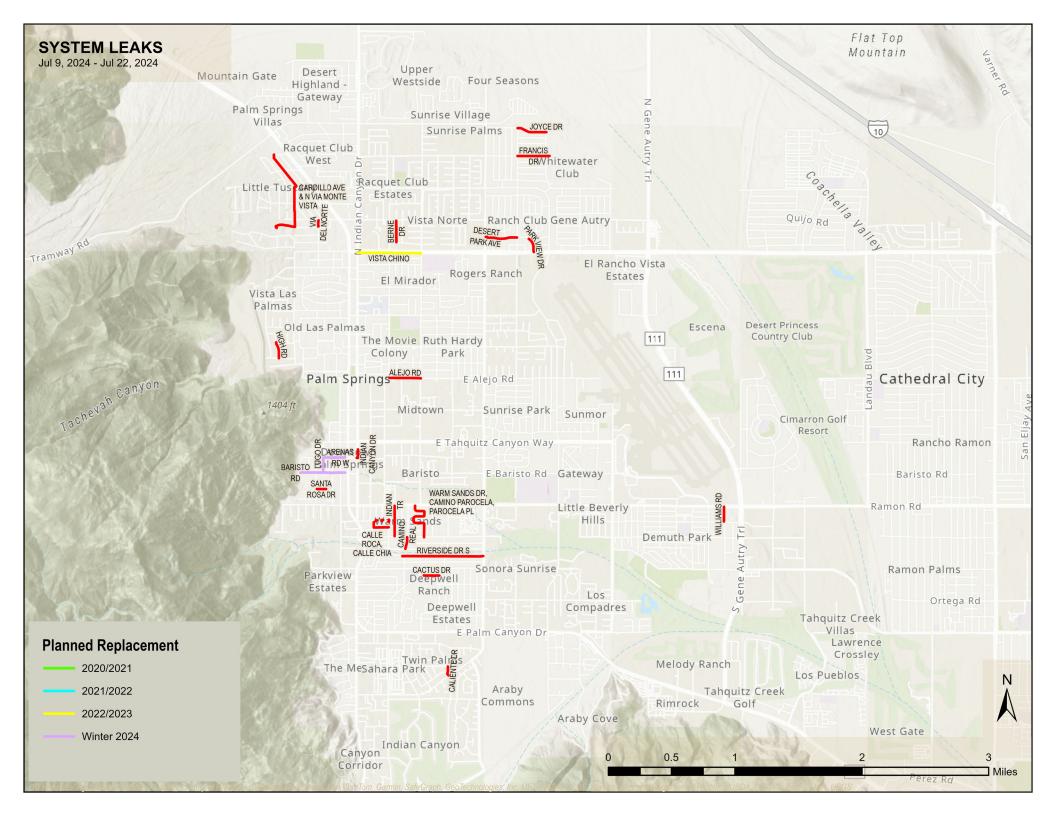
